## Household Electronics Disposal

York County Solid Waste Authority has relocated its Residential Electronics Recycling Program directly across the street from the York County Resource center on Blackbridge Road in Manchester Township. The weekly program is free and open to York County **residents only** every Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday from 3:00 pm to 6:30 pm.



Directions from Route 30:

At the stoplight at the intersection of Toronita Street and Route 30 (you will see the "Round the Clock Diner" at this intersection), turn north onto Toronita Street (Toronita turns into Blackbridge Road). Proceed approximately 2 miles to Flour Mill Road. Turn right onto Flour Mill Road, the Yard Waste Transfer Facility will be on your right,

## THANKSGIVING



York Area United Fire and Rescue discourages the use of outdoor gas-fueled turkey fryers that immerse the turkey in hot oil. These turkey fryers use a substantial quantity of cooking oil at high temperatures, and units currently available for home use pose a significant danger that hot oil will be released at some point during the cooking process. The use of turkey fryers by consumers can lead to devastating burns, other injuries and the destruction of

property. York Area United Fire and Rescue urges those who prefer fried turkey to seek out professional establishments, such as grocery stores, specialty food retailers, and restaurants for the preparation of the dish, or consider a new type of “oil-less turkey fryer.”

DAYLIGHT SAVINGS TIME will end November 6, 2016. Daniel Hoff would like to remind our citizens and residents to provide a fresh battery in their smoke and CO alarms.

Important: Replace your smoke alarm if it is more than 10 years old.

#### **In Case of Fire Follow Your Escape Plan!**

Remember to **GET OUT, STAY OUT** and **CALL 9-1-1** or your local emergency

- If closed doors or handles are warm, use your second way out. Never open doors that are warm to the touch.
- Crawl low under smoke. Go to your outside meeting place and then call for help.
- If smoke, heat or flames lock your exit routes, stay in the room with doors closed. Place a wet towel under the door and call 911. Open a window and wave a brightly colored cloth or flashlight to signal for help.

**NPDES MUNICIPAL SEPARATE STORM SEWER SYSTEM (MS4)  
GENERAL PERMIT**

The Stormwater Management Program for North York Borough, York County, Pennsylvania (NPDES Permit No. PAG133581, Authorization ID No. 949687) consists of the following six Minimum Control Measure (MCMs):

- MCM #1: Public Education and Outreach on Stormwater Impacts
- MCM #2: Public Involvement/Participation
- MCM #3: Illicit Discharge Detection and Elimination (IDD & E)
- MCM #4: Construction Site Runoff Control
- MCM #5: Post-Construction Stormwater Management (PCSM) in New and Re-Development Activities.
- MCM #6: Pollution Prevention/Good Housekeeping for Municipal Operations

The goal of the Stormwater Management Program, above Minimum Control Measures and the MS4 General Permit is to reduce stormwater pollution in order to improve water quality in the local waterbodies and ultimately the Chesapeake Bay. The program provides for public education, requests public involvement and provides a means for the Borough to control stormwater discharges within the Borough limits.

The Borough will conduct a yearly public education and outreach presentation on the MS4 permit to discuss the program, update the public on the program status and solicit public involvement/participation. The presentation in 2016 will be held during the regularly scheduled Borough Council meeting on October 11, 2016

One way residents can help is to cleanup pet waste so it is not washed into the Borough's storm sewer system. Please contact the Borough if you have any questions.
