Attention All Residents

Unlicensed, out of inspection vehicles parked on public streets are not handled by the Borough Codes Officer, they are a police matter and as such may be reported to Northern Regional Police by any resident. The staff at Northern Regional is very efficient at taking the report. There is a procedure that must be followed to have such vehicles removed.

Also, North York Borough's Codes Officer is not allowed to run registration checks on vehicles parked on the street.

## Codes Enforcement

Homeowners & Residents:

It's that time of year again! It is the homeowner and residents responsibility to maintain your yard work (grass and weeds), including sidewalks & curbing.

Thank you for your attention to this matter. Let's all try to work together to make North York Borough a better place.

**TREES, BUSHES, GRASS AND WEEDS:** Grass must be kept trimmed and no higher than 6". Trees over streets must be trimmed to a height of 14' and over sidewalks to 7'. Weeds and brush must also be trimmed or removed from property.

**POOLS:** You must get a permit and have an inspection for any swimming pools. Permits and copies of the regulations are available at the borough office.



**Street sweeping dates for 2017 are May 22, 23, 24.**

**The dates for 2018 are May 21, 22, 23.**

Remember to sweep your sidewalk the night before to push any road cinders into the street.

**Cars must be removed or they will be in violation and will be ticketed.**

## Liberty Volunteer Fire Company News

Liberty Fire Company asks' residents to be sure street numbers are highly visible on homes and businesses. The fire department advises residents to walk out in the street and see if your house numbers can be easily seen. Do this at night time as well. If the numbers can be seen, then the fire department has a greater chance of saving a life.

### Here are some basic rules to follow:

- The numbers on the residence and business should be at least four inches high.
- The numbers should be a contrasting color to the background if not reflective.
- Numbers should be placed on, above or at the side of the main entrance so that they can be easily detected from the street.
- If the entrance is more than 50 feet from the street, or cannot be seen from the street, a second set of numbers should also be displayed on the mailbox or on a post at the street or the end of the driveway.
- Remember, your mailman always comes the same way. Police and fire trucks may come from any direction. Be sure to mark both sides of your mailbox, or mark your house number in such a way that it may be easily seen, no matter which direction they are approaching from.
- Reflective numbers or one of the new light-up signs is recommended.

**An Important Message About Medical Waste Disposal From Penn Waste**

**Medical waste needs to be properly disposed of in the TRASH, not the RECYCLING.**

In 2016 Penn Waste received over 500 pounds of medical waste at our recycling facility! This is a public safety hazard for our team members who manually sort through the recycling and are at risk of getting stuck by a needle.

If a person does not have a sharps container to dispose of their medical waste, they should do the following:

- Place their medical waste in a thick container that has a lid such as a coffee can or detergent bottle.
- Make sure the lid is secure on the container by duct taping it shut and place it in the TRASH.
